

Paola Gandolfi is Professor of "Educational policies in the Arabic and Islamic Countries of the Mediterranean" (Faculty of Human Sciences, Department of Literature, Arts and Multimedia). Currently, she also teaches "Migration, Education, Development issues"(Faculty of Sciences of Education, University of Bergamo). She is a member of the Scientific Board of Unesco Chair of the University of Bergamo. She has worked as a researcher for centres of research and universities, in Italy and abroad (Maghreb, France). Her main research interests are: educational policies of the Arabic and Islamic countries of the Mediterranean; transnational migratory mobility between Maghreb and Europe; Moroccan migrants in Italy and change processes in contemporary Morocco; religious origins in daily pedagogical practices – but also political and anthropological practices - in Maghreb (also collaborating within RAMSES: Network of excellence of international research in Human and Social Sciences in the Mediterranean, MMSH, Aix en Provence).

As a specialist of Arabic Language (and Moroccan dialect) and Arabic culture, she also works and investigates on intercultural educational projects in migratory contexts and on the cultural and linguistics rights of migrants in educational contexts, between Maghreb and Europe. Among her recent publications: "Le Maroc aujourd'hui" (Il Ponte, Bologna, 2008) and "L'arabo a scuola?" (Il Ponte, Bologna, 2006).
