The Therapeutic Alliance is widely recognized as one of the best predictors of psychotherapy treatment outcome, even if according to some meta-analyses it accounts for only about 7% of the variance in outcome studies. Thus, there is an interest in understanding other factors that impact the therapeutic relationship and can explain ruptures in the alliance. Referential Activity is a language measure of recent interest, which has been shown to reliably detect variations in the emotional engagement of patient and therapist during psychotherapy sessions.

This seminar will explore the relationship between the Therapeutic Alliance and Referential Activity from a theoretical, research and clinical point of view. Two research tools will be presented to illustrate their application in detecting ruptures in the therapeutic alliance: Segmented Working Alliance Inventory (SWAIO; Berk, Safran, Muran & Eubanks-Carter, 2010) and the Weighted Referential Activity Dictionary (WRAD; Bucci, 2014). Participants will practice and discuss in small groups the application of these scoring methods.
