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Dr Massimiliano Vaghi, holds a **PhD in International History** (*Dottore di Ricerca in Storia internazionale*) and **Post-doc in Modern History** at University of Milan (*Assegno di Ricerca quadriennale in Storia Moderna, Università degli Studi di Milano*), is **Senior Researcher in Asian History** at the University of Bergamo (*Ricercatore rtd-B in Storia e istituzioni dell'Asia, Università degli Studi di Bergamo*).

Dr Vaghi is a member of the SISI (*Società Italiana di Storia Internazionale*) and author of books, articles and essays published in Italy, France, U.S.A. and India. In 2012 He was Associate Researcher at the *Institut d'Histoire de la Révolution française* (Paris-Sorbonne University) and, in 2018, Visiting Professor at the *Groupe de Recherche d'Histoire (GRHis)*, University of Rouen Normandie.

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Main research areas:

- Asia-Europe Relations, political and military interaction between East and West, interaction of civilizations;
- French colonialism in South-Asia and Middle-East;
- Colonial and European order from the Revolution to the First Empire;
- History of mentalities and ideas, and European Orientalism;
- History of colonial and precolonial India.
