Memory, Reflexivity, and Personal Identity: Does the Lockean Tradition Rest on a Mistake?

Lockeanism about personal identity is the view that the persistence of persons is grounded in psychological continuity over time. *Reflexivism* about episodic memory is the view that the content of episodic memories is reflexive: a memory of a past experience represents this experience as belonging to the rememberer—in other words, episodic memory contains a 'sense of mineness'. In the first part of this talk, I shall argue that Lockeanism rests on reflexivism. In the second part, I shall argue against reflexivism. I shall conclude that Lockeanism rests on a mistake
